A Time for Reflection

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

The observance of Lent, the 40 days beginning with Ash Wednesday and climaxing during Holy Week with Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and finally Holy Saturday, originated in the Church in the Fourth century. Lent (derived from an Anglo Saxon word "lencten" meaning the time when days grow longer) traditionally is a time of preparation for those about to be baptized through focused study prayer, introspection, self examination and repentance. As the newly baptized are entering a community of faith, the entire community or congregation is likewise called to the same preparation. During the season of Lent we change our liturgical colors in the sanctuary to purple, a color of royalty

and penance to reflect outwardly our focus on Christ's suffering, death and hope of the resurrection. Although Lent is a somber time, we cannot lose sight that it culminates in the joyous and glorious festival of Easter, the resurrection of our Lord and Savior. Indeed, even in Lent, Sundays remain feast days and are considered "little Easters" celebrating the resurrection of our Lord. I invite you to join with the community of Church of the Incarnation as we journey through Lent.

I hope you will take the opportunity to participate in one or more of the offerings. May you have a
